"I believe, there is one eternal, invisible, Almighty, ever-blessed, living and true God, who created all things out of nothing, by the word of his power; upholdeth all things by his own omnipotent arm; who governs all things by an all-wise providence; and who takes cognizance of all our thoughts, words, and actions."

I believe, that God has revealed to man, his holy and righteous will in the scriptures of the old and new testament; and I do receive and embrace them as a divine revelation from God, and as the only rule of faith and practice."

"I believe, there is a full sufficiency of the mind and will of God, contained in the old and new testament, to make men wise (by the teaching of Jehovah the Spirit) unto salvation; all truths necessary to be known and received into the heart are therein contained; and whatever doctrine is delivered by any man, which is not contained in, or cannot be proved from the word of God, should be altogether rejected."

"I believe, there are three divine persons in the Godhead; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; who are equal in nature, in power, and in glory: and that the Son and Holy Spirit are as truly and properly God, as the Father; whom I revere, serve, and worship."

"I believe, that God hath decreed in himself, from all eternity, all things whatsoever come to pass; and that a certain number of our fellow-creatures were predestinated to the adoption of children by Jesus Christ, who was set up from everlasting as the head of that covenant, which secures grace and glory to all the vessels of mercy."

"I believe, that the ever-blessed God created man in his own image, which consists in righteousness, knowledge, and true holiness; and in this state of purity the Lord laid his creature man under certain obligations to obey his precepts; but man violated the law given him, and inconsequence of this violation, lost the image of God; immediately was under the curse of the law he had broken, became subject to all the miseries of this life, as pain, sorrow, labour, affliction, and death."

"I believe, that God from everlasting loved a peculiar people, which he chose in Christ before the foundation of the world, unto salvation, holiness, spiritual affection, and good works; that this eternal and personal election is entirely of free, sovereign grace. That Jesus Christ is the alone Saviour of the chosen seed; and in order to effect this salvation, he took all their iniquities on himself; so that the sins of all the chosen seed were in covenant transferred to Christ Jesus, their covenant head and surety; and that this covenant and all the blessings of it shall stand fast with him."

special, and only designed for those who are elect according to the foreknowledge of God.
